Dear Rochester Resident,

We want to offer an explanation behind the substantial water rate hikes that will occur over the course of the next year. We have spent countless hours with our municipal financial advisors deliberating on what we must do to keep our water utility in the black while we face increasing maintenance and repair needs. Additionally, a portion of the rate increase, 25-30%, is in place for growth, infrastructure needed for housing, and business development. As much as we regret these rate increases, it is absolutely necessary in order to continue offering water service and to move our community forward. Our current rates are less than half of the state average as we have not had any rate increases for nearly 15 years. Thus, our cash reserves are minimal to be able to meet the current maintenance and growth demands.

This, like our Sewer Department, is a standalone utility that must cash flow itself, and with the high cost of short and long-term needs, these rate increases are necessary to support the bond we must take out to finance them. We also are shifting the fire protection cost from your property tax bill to the water utility. This allows us to better align the cost associated with fire protection infrastructure and capacity with those that benefit. I know this is a lot to absorb so we will be phasing these increases in by having 30% of the rate increase of this to occur in January 2025, another 20% in July 2025, and the final 50% of the increase in January 2026. When all of this is complete, we will be near the state average for municipally-owned water utilities, yet still well under several Indiana communities who have sold those utilities off to a public utility company.

We are looking at several ways to help offset this increased cost of living to our citizens. We have formed a Sidewalk Committee, to partner with our Tree Board, to score, evaluate and recommend replacement at no cost to the homeowner. This will be done each year to the limit of our \$50,000 budget. Also, we are considering an Individual Housing Tax Abatement for those who need or wish to do upgrading to their homes which could increase their assessed value. Finally, we are working very hard to get a discount grocery store in town that I believe will help dramatically in reducing weekly costs to our families. We are always open to more ideas, so please feel free to share those with us in hopes to continue to make our community better and an affordable place to live and do business.

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING RATE INCREASE

RESOLUTION NO. 32-2024

WHEREAS, the City of Rochester, Indiana Water Board (the "Board") is charged with the operation of the waterworks under IC 8-1.5; and

WHEREAS, the Board previously determined that there is a need to undertake certain projects for the improvement of the waterworks; and

WHEREAS, the Board pursuant to Resolution No. 30-2024 requested the Common Council of the City of Rochester, Indiana to issue waterworks revenue bonds for the payment of such costs (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the rates and charges currently imposed are not sufficient to meet the financial requirements of the waterworks.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

Section 1. The Board requests that the City take all necessary steps to increase its waterworks user rates to ensure sufficient revenues to meet the needs of the waterworks, including sufficient revenues to provide for payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds.

Section 2. The proposed rates and charges are set forth in Exhibit A hereto, subject to adjustment as may be deemed necessary.
